Is The LORD Among Us Or Not?

The Israelites have always puzzled me. When they were slaves in Egypt, they cried out to be rescued. God heard them and began to initiate their liberation. The LORD called Moses to lead his people to freedom. Here's what puzzles me.

- The LORD leads them out of Egypt by a visible pillar of cloud by day and a visible pillar of fire by night and one of the two was always visible (Ex. 13:21,22). In other words, there was never a question as to whether the LORD was among them.
- When they came to their first obstacle, the Red Sea, they immediately want to go back to Egypt (Ex. 14:12).
- Moses assures them the LORD will fight on their behalf all they have to do is watch (Ex. 14:14).
- Moses stretches his hands over the sea, the sea parts, and Israel walks on dry ground to the other side, and is saved as their enemies drown in the sea all the while, the pillar of cloud protected them. This salvation provoked a great response from Israel. "Israel saw the great power that the Lord used against the Egyptians, so the people feared the Lord, and they believed in the Lord and in his servant Moses" (Ex. 14:31).
- The people grumbled because the water at Marah was bitter. The LORD made is drinkable (Ex. 15:25).
- Then the LORD led them to 12 springs of water where they camped (Ex. 15:27).
- Not long after their fill of water, they accused the LORD of bringing them out of Egypt so they could die of hunger. God gives them manna and quail (Ex. 16).

Now the process begins to repeat. In Exodus 17:1-3, the Bible says, "All the congregation of the people of Israel moved on from the wilderness of Sin by stages, according to the commandment of the Lord, and camped at Rephidim, but there was no water for the people to drink. Therefore, the people quarreled with Moses and said, "Give us water to drink." And Moses said to them, "Why do you quarrel with me? Why do you test the Lord?" But the people thirsted there for water, and the people grumbled against Moses and said, "Why did you bring us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our livestock with thirst?" They had already witnessed the LORD's ability to quench their thirst, and now they complain again. Verse 17 says, they tested the LORD by saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?" What? As they complained and questioned the LORD's presence, they could look at the pillar of cloud and fire and know the LORD was ALWAYS AMONG THEM!!!

How often do we question the LORD's presence, His care, and His work in our life as we enjoy and consume His constant blessings?
