Misinformed

Denzel Washington is quoted as saying, "If you don't read the newspaper, you're uninformed, if you read the newspaper, you are misinformed". Living in the information age, we have become so accustomed to having answers to all of our questions, regardless of the topic. In many ways this is a blessing, because it allows us to be informed and make educated decisions. On the other hand, it has made several individuals believe that they are experts in nearly every subject. I'm certain you have seen this yourself. Occasionally though, every individual, expert or otherwise, can be wrong. One way or another information can circulate that is simply false or misleading. We call this misinformation. This happens for a number of reasons. It may be that those proliferating the information simply received false information which they failed to verify. More commonly people accept and spread information that helps to support their own worldview or agenda in order to sway others to their cause. One way or another this misinformation often becomes prevalent enough to lead many people astray and even sometimes convince people to reject truth. What is more damaging though is that, on nearly every issue, misinformation is abundant on every side, and people seem unaware of their own biases. This leads to individuals looking at "facts" to come to opposing conclusions. The New Testament writers greatly emphasized the importance of diligently verifying the information we receive. In Galatians 1:8-9 Paul says:

"But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed. As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed.

It is often easy to yield to the temptation to believe and share things which are simply not true, because we so badly want them to be true. Some misinformation would just be so much more convenient or affirming to our worldview if it were true, but if we are not living in the truth, are we really living as intended? We must stay vigilant to prove every word we speak according to the truth of Scripture and example of Christ. Not only must our words be factual but they must be godly and glorifying. If we choose to ignore the truth, we are uninformed, if we consume the modern media, we are likely misinformed, but we can take security in knowing that God's Word never needs a redaction, as it will forever be the truth.
