"Was Iesus Woke?"

Jesus had one purpose – to help her realize her true need. She was a sinner who needed what only he could provide! He did not focus on making her feel good about herself. In fact, he ignored her inquiry addressing the ethnic feeling between Jews and Samaritans – "You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?"

Later in their conversation, Jesus responded to her question regarding the proper place to worship (another sensitive topic), "You Samaritans worship what you do not know; we (Jews) worship what we do know. . .. " Should she have been insulted? She wasn't. "Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony."

His goal was not to right all the wrongs in the world, but rather to touch every human heart with the realization of our sinful condition and show us the path to reconciliation to God the

Jesus addressed physical needs. So must we. But he was crystal clear about his purpose - "The son of man came to seek and save that which is lost." Everything else was secondary to that goal. And he was also clear about what our purpose as his followers is to be - "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation"
