Back in the old days when I was a freshman in high school, my school had an initiation tradition called "Dog Days." A senior could "buy" a freshman for a week. The freshman was a "dog" and the senior was his "master." What that translated into was the freshman had to make himself available to the senior during lunch periods and recesses for whatever his master wanted him to do. Normally it was things like carrying his books, carrying his lunch tray, competing against other dogs in various athletic events, getting down on one knee and proposing to a girl, etc.

The innovative seniors bought/made collars for their dogs to wear and they carried a leash to make sure you walked at "heel" at all times. One of my friend's master was unusually creative - he made a collar by stringing onions and garlics cut in half. He had to wear it for a week! Nobody wanted to be near him.

I've often thought of that as an illustration of someone who carries a grudge and is unwilling to forgive. Anger, bitterness and hatred destroys you from the inside. Soon no one wants to be around you. And that causes you to grow even more bitter.

I've heard numerous people defend their "right" to be bitter and angry. They say, "You don't know what they did to me/said about me!" Would you like to compare scars? But if you want to claim that right to hold onto your grudge, I won't deny you that pleasure! Go right ahead. It's your life.

While I wouldn't deny you your right, I would dare to mention another, even more serious, consequence of your failure to forgive. It is contained in Jesus' model prayer in Matthew 6. Listen . . . "Forgive us the wrong we have done, as we have *forgiven those who have wronged us* ... For if you forgive your fellow men the wrongs they have done against you, your Father will also forgive you ... But if you do not forgive others when they have wronged you, neither will your Father forgive the wrongs you have

done."

Romans chapter 5 reminds us that God forgave our sins when we were "powerless . . . ungodly . . . sinners and his enemies." God is not willing that <u>anvone</u> should perish. Do you want someone to perish?

Do yourself, your family and friends and your eternal future a tremendous favor - forgive. You can't heal until you do!
