Biblical Economics

Did you know that there are some sound economic principles in the Bible? One of them is found in II Thessalonians 3:10. It says "... If anyone is unwilling to work, he should not eat."

The context is Paul's contrast between his own history of working to provide for his own food while he was in Thessalonica in contrast to some members of the church there who wanted others to take care of them.

His solution to this problem was to command those who were not working to "... settle down and work for their own bread."

Since the earliest of times God has required his people to be concerned about and generous to those who are poor. The early church was (Acts 2), the elders and apostles in Jerusalem admonished Paul to "continue to remember the poor" (Gal. 2). Paul spent a considerable amount of time and energy encouraging the Gentile Christians to send financial assistance to the drought victims in Judea. So we have plenty of encouragement and precedents to help those who are unable to help themselves.

But God wants us to work to earn what is needed to provide for ourselves and our family. That is both a physical and spiritual principle. The Greek word meaning in II Thessalonians 3:11 indicates that if we are not busy about our own affairs we tend to be trying to tend to other folks' affairs!

We have a classic example in our own time of attempting to create an environment that encourages people not to work, but rather live off the work of others – a violation of biblical and common-sense economics. It will be interesting to watch this crisis unfold.

God intended for mankind to work and be productive.

Back in the day when common sense seemed to be more common, parents told their children "Idleness is the devil's workshop!"

Can you imagine the impact of implementing this one simple principle in our society?
