War or Peace

The Bible has a considerable amount to say about Peace - peace between the Jew and Gentile in the early church... peace between God and mankind... peace within the body of Christ. God is called "... the God of peace." In the Old Testament the Judge Gideon built an altar which he named "YHWH- Shalom" – "Jehovah, my peace."

The word peace can carry different meanings. We say at the end of a war when one of the combatants is totally defeated and forced to sign a "peace treaty" that we have peace. But that's more along the lines of a **truce** than peace. A truce means, from a practical standpoint, that we agree to stop killing one another. That's a pretty shallow definition of peace. I'm not saying that it's not desirable, but it falls short of true peace. Hatred may continue. Particularly if one side has been devastatingly defeated. There is a winner and a loser.

A deeper definition of peace is **reconciliation**. That's the kind of peace that God offers. . . and that he requires from his followers. Not an enforced truce, but a "glad surrender." The offended totally forgives the offender. The Greek word denotes an exchange. . . i.e. to exchange hatred and anger for unity and harmony. There are no losers. Everyone wins.

In most wars, both sides see themselves as the "offended" . . . the victim. Over the years I've learned a great deal by listening to folks who came from a different background than myself. I will always remember the shock I received when I heard a lesson from a gospel preacher, Gottfried Reichel, who was born and reared in Munich, Germany. He was a teenager when he woke up one morning and looked out his window to see Allied tanks in the city square of Munich. I was dumbfounded to hear him say that he decided at that moment that there was no God- because he believed that God was on the side of Germany during that war!

There are many, many people in the world who have been/are being mistreated. They have a just cause. We can fight with one another and kill one another with both sides feeling justified. And "... the bloody morning after... one tin soldier rides away." OR, we can make the decision that we want peace, not a forced truce, but reconciliation. No more hostility.

For that to happen, we must both lay down our arms, step out from behind our defenses, sit down together and do more listening than talking.

Letter from Elders

June 12, 2020

Woodland Oaks Brothers and Sisters,

Three weeks ago we began phase 1 of our plans to reopen our assemblies following our Governor's Executive Orders related to COVID-19. As our state begins to lift requirements we are moving forward with plans to gradually reopen our services in phases. While the pandemic does appears to be slowing, it still remains a very real threat to many of our "at-risk" members and as such, we will remain consistent with the state's guidance on the Minimum Standard Health Protocols for places of worship. We are all anxious to return to "normal" as soon as possible, but it is in the best interest of our congregation's spiritual, physical and emotional health to proceed with caution and protect all members. We do ask for your continued prayers, patience and cooperation.

That said, beginning on Sunday, June 21, we will proceed with phase 2. Highlighted below is a summary of what this phase entails.

- We continue to encourage those in high risk categories for infection to stay home and continue to stream our worship services for your safety. This includes those older than 65, diabetics, those with chronic heart or lung disease, those with immune deficiencies and some pregnant women. Some parents with small children may want to consider staying home and streaming as well.
- The major change associated with phase 2 is that we will resume bible classes where we can safely social distance. This will include a single adult bible class (in the auditorium), a single youth class (for grades 7-12 in the Chapel) and a single children's class (for ages 0 through 6th grade that will be held in the Family Life Center).
- Classes will be taught from 9:15 10 a.m. and worship assembly will begin at 10:15 a.m.
- As we transition from class to the assembly, parents are requested to keep your children with you at all times and to address any bathroom needs before the assembly begins.
- All previous guidance on social distancing in worship assemblies will remain in effect. If you have not recently attended our worship services as part of our phase 1 reopening, we encourage you to read the attached document entitled "What to Expect Phase 1 and 2".

If you will be joining us onsite for worship or classes, we ask you to self-screen before coming to the assembly. If you are running a fever or showing any potential symptoms (cough, chills, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, shortness of breath, etc.), please stay home and stream services.

We thank everyone for your ongoing cooperation, encouragement and prayers.
