Over the course of my time in ministry, I have written a lot about love. Love is objectively an integral part of our understanding of faith and of God. It makes up the very nature of who God is, and is the standard factor by which we imitate Him. There is plenty to write about what love is and, more relevant to our society, what love is not. Today the mainstream Christian religion has become deviated by many who foster otherwise baseless ideologies of God's nature and His will for our lives on the basis of a restructuring of the definition of love. In their mind, if love is the most important aspect of who God is, then whatever other teachings they receive through scripture that they feel do not qualify as loving ought to be omitted. Not only so, but they audaciously proclaim that all those who refuse to omit these commands in scripture are not 'true Christians' because they refuse to adhere to the most important principle of scripture, which is love. This logic seems sound in their own minds, but there is a massive gap in this system of belief; it relies on our own interpretation, or sometimes the world's interpretation, of what love is. Rather than reshaping their own interpretation of what love is to fit to the truth of scripture, the consensus

among many popularized organizations claiming to be Christian is to conform the command to love around society's own definitions. In their mind, some commands of Scripture cannot be fulfilled as they violate their own interpretation of what it means to love. The irony is that, by redefining love as they have, they have created a world in which people are taught to hate those who do not agree on their own definition of love, and have created a system in which brother hates brother and justifies it under the banner of love. You need look no further than our own streets to see that this love which the world proposes is not true or right.

John gives us a solid test in his writings of how to know that our love is true. In John's second letter, he writes this,

"And now, dear lady, I am not writing you a new command but one we have had from the beginning. I ask that we love one another. And this is love: that we walk in obedience to his commands. As you have heard from the beginning, his command is that you walk in love."

We cannot love without fulfilling the commands of God. The truest way to show love is to follow the commands which we have been given by God. Anyone who claims that the commands of scripture ought to be ignored or reinterpreted because they do not fit the definition of "love" has misinterpreted what love truly is. If we want to fulfill the greatest commandment, which is to love, we must make adhering to the teachings of scripture a priority, because it is our greatest insight into what it truly
