CHANGE

One day, when our daughter was about twelve years old, my wife decided that it was time to give her bedroom some serious spring-cleaning. Soon the closet was disgorged of its contents and items were pulled from under the bed. All of the things that had once been so valued in the mind of a child-the bits of paper, pictures, various items from fast-food restaurants, the play bank, the play store, and other forgotten items-were soon brought to light. The piles of stuffed animals, dolls, play clothes, and boxes of all sizes and shapes spilled out into the hallway all the way to the living room. Next came the process of sorting-throwing away this item and placing that item in a box to be returned to the closet or under the bed.

This went on from Saturday afternoon until evening and was finally completed on Sunday afternoon. I was called in for various phases of the work, such as reaching under the bed or up into the closet, but mostly I stayed out of the way.

I was given one special task. I was asked to untangle some necklaces that had been unearthed. Some of these were actual pieces of jewelry. Others, however, were the multicolored plastic variety, which are worn by little girls before they begin to feel

As I held these necklaces in my hand my mind went back to earlier days. For some reason, I was usually the one given the task of fastening those necklaces for our daughter. I began to recall how they were not really designed for a father's large hands and how many times I had fumbled with these fasteners on a Sunday morning. I was saddened to realize that I am no longer needed for such important tasks. In those days my success as a father was measured by whether or not I could fasten a necklace, tie a bow on the back of a dress, or fix a broken toy.

What happened to my status in fatherhood? The problem is change. Nothing ever stays the same. Change is inevitable. Our children grow up and soon they are no longer children anymore. We grow older. Wrinkles develop. Hair turns gray or falls out. Our own parents begin to age and one day they are not around anymore. Change can be almost imperceptibly slow. Or, it can come in an instant. A medical diagnosis or a phone call late at night can change one's life forever.

There is nothing that we can do about changes in our lives. The daughter that was once twelve years old is now married and lives in her own home, so the process of change continues. Sometimes I wish that I could still sit in the "big chair" with our children and read them stories or watch Sesame Street again, but I can't. We cannot stop change, nor can we return to another time. No matter how much we might want to, there is no way to go back to the "good ole days."

There is only one source of security in this world of change. It is the hope that we have in Christ. Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away" (Matthew 24:35). Long before Jesus spoke these words, God's people were aware of his eternal and unchanging nature. Moses, in his blessing on the children of Israel had said, "The eternal God is your refuge and underneath are the everlasting arms" (Deuteronomy 33:27). David, the psalmist wrote, "The Lord reigns forever...The Lord is the refuge for the oppressed, a stronghold in times of trouble. Those who know your name will trust in you, for you Lord, have never forsaken those who seek you" (Psalm 9:7, 9-10). Isaiah described God's unchanging nature in this way: "Trust in the Lord forever, for the Lord, the Lord, is the Rock eternal" (Isaiah 26:4). Perhaps the writer of Hebrews summed it up best when he wrote: "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8).

Many things will change in our lives. The only thing that will not change is God himself. No matter what happens, we have the assurance that God and his Son Jesus, love us, are concerned about us, and have made a way for us to live with them in a place where nothing will change.
