Shaped by Faith? ... or Fear?

The opposite of faith is not necessarily doubt; often, it's fear . . . maybe far more often.

As you look back on your life, can you see times when you let fear keep you from doing something you really wanted to do? You wouldn't take a particular class because you were afraid it was too hard?

I remember as a kid I wanted to learn to swim, but I was afraid. I was fishing with my dad one day and complaining that I didn't know how to swim. He picked me up and threw me out of the boat into the river. When I surfaced and thrashed my way back to the boat, he would hit my hand with a paddle every time I tried to grab the side of the boat! I learned to swim. I just needed a little helping hand. (Janis still gets mad when I tell that story.)

I wonder how much of our life has been shaped by fear. We wanted to do something \dots to be something \dots to try something - but we were afraid. So, it passed us by.

In a poem entitled "Maud Muller", John Greenleaf Whittier pens these famous words, "For all sad words of tongue and pen, the saddest are these, 'It might have been'." There are not so many regrets in life about something we tried and failed, but many lives are far poorer because we failed to try.

The Bible tells us that "Faith is the victory that overcomes the world." That's because through faith we tap into resources far beyond our own resources and abilities. The Bible also tells us that "There is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear." So does faith. So does hope. Fear is the enemy of faith, hope and love. Fear strangles them all.

How many times did Jesus tell his disciples, "Fear not." and "O you of little faith. Why are you afraid?" He also told them "I have overcome the world.", "All power has been given to me in heaven and on earth." and "I will never leave you or forsake you."

"I was afraid" is an acceptable excuse for most of us. Saying the words brings all progress to an immediate halt. But it's not acceptable to our Lord. Seriously.

In the closing chapters of the Bible - "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the vile, and murderers, the sexually immoral, and sorcerers, those who practice magic arts, the idolaters and all liars - their place will be in the fiery lake of burning sulfur. This is the second death."

Can you give an answer to what Jesus asked his disciples – "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

Woodland Oaks Brothers and Sisters,

Effective September 9, we will begin a soft restart of our Wednesday evening services. This will include time for songs and prayer, followed by a combined adult Bible class and combined youth class.
