America is setting the table for her future. One out of three children will go to bed tonight without a father in the home. The Center for Disease Control recently reported that 40% of American children were born out of wedlock in 2007. A Gallup Survey found that 64% of young adults 18 to 29 believe that having a child out of wedlock is “morally acceptable.” And, of course, as these children grow into adulthood, they will be defensive of their upbringing.

Dads have become expendable.

In the midst of this bleak picture, I am taking advantage of editorship by using one of my sons-in-law as an example of a young man who has ordered his life to enable him to make his family a top priority.

He has disciplined his life to gain an education that gives him job options. He is currently working for a company that needs his abilities (including speaking a foreign language) in another country. The offer they made him represents an incredible “leap” up the corporate and financial ladder. But it also required him to spend more time away from home than at home. He immediately told them he wasn’t interested- because he was unwilling to sacrifice that much time away from his family. His superiors were flabbergasted. They couldn’t conceive of anyone turning down such an opportunity.

I’m proud of him. I’m proud to have him as husband to my daughter and dad to my grandchildren. I’m proud of every man who makes his responsibility as dad and husband top priority in his life.
