Vincent Van Gogh's life was marked with failure. That sounds surprising, but throughout his entire career as an artist, we're told he only sold one painting, and he died penniless. He only gained acknowledgement as a painter after his death. Van Gogh's first job was as an art dealer. However, he wasn't successful and was fired. He then worked briefly as a schoolteacher in England. When that didn't work out, he started working in a bookstore back in the Netherlands. At a later stage, Van Gogh became devoutly religious and tried to pursue a life in the clergy. However, the church dismissed him because of his overly enthusiastic commitment to his faith. Later, Van Gogh decided to be an artist an produced over 900 paintings without any formal training. One of his most famous paintings, Starry Night, was painted in a psychiatric hospital. However, in his lifetime, Van Gogh made no money from painting. He was financially supported by his brother, Theo Van Gogh, for his entire life. Amazingly, today Van Gogh's fame is worldwide, and his paintings are sold for recordbreaking sums in the most prestigious art auctions! In 2022, 132 years after his death, Orchard with Cypresses sold for a staggering \$117.2 million at Christie's New York. https://www.itravelwithart.com/iconic-van-gogh-<u>art/</u>

On Sunday nights, we will begin a study of 1 Samuel. This book chronicles the end of the judges, Israel's transition from a theocracy to a monarchy, and records the anointing of the first two kings: Saul and David. 1 Samuel is named so for its central character, Samuel, and is a historical narrative that records some of the most well-known events of Biblical history. Our time on Sunday nights will not a be a verse-by-verse study but a study of the key narratives found in the book. I don't know where you are in your Bible reading but you might like to skip ahead and read 1 Samuel.
